


Critical issues related to Article 21.c

I. Is there a mandate for dedicated Art. 2. I.c negotiations?



Unlike 2.1.a (mitigation), which is cross referenced in 4.1 and 2.1.b (adaptation) which is cross referenced in 7.1, there is no similar reference for Article 2, paragraph 1(c) in the text of the PA,

That leaves it open for discussion, whether it is mandated in the PA to build on this article or if it may be considered a declarative goal, not requiring further negotiation. as 'legally non-prescriptive'. limited to setting out what the Agreement 'aims' to do.

2. Scope and Remit



As the scope of Article 2.1c goes beyond climate finance and involves other financial flows that would have to be assessed against the PA goals, it may be the subject of discussion whether this is in the PA's mandate such "nonclimate finance". It should also be considered that 2.1.c involves a diversity of actors who are not legally bound by (outside the remit) of the decisions issued by the COP or the CMA.



Interpretations of negotiators on how these two articles relate to each other range from Article 9 having no relation to Article 2.1c to Article 9 as inherently part of Article 2.1c, since it also concerns financial flows.

In this context developing countries are concerned that increasing attention on Article 2.1c could lead developed countries to neglect their obligations under Article 9.
