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

Article 14 (Paris Agreement) Objective:



1. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to this Agreement shall periodically take stock of the **implementation** of this Agreement to assess the collective progress towards achieving the purpose of this Agreement and its long-term goals (referred to as the "global stocktake"). It shall do so in a comprehensive and facilitative manner, considering mitigation, adaptation and the means of implementation and support, and in the light of equity and the best available science.

2. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to this Agreement shall undertake its first global stocktake **in 2023 and every five years thereafter** unless otherwise decided by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to this Agreement.


<u>Article 14 (Paris Agreement)</u> <u>Purpose:</u>



3. The outcome of the global stocktake <u>shall inform Parties in</u> <u>updating and enhancing, in a nationally determined manner,</u> <u>their actions and support</u> in accordance with the relevant provisions of this Agreement, as well as <u>in enhancing</u> <u>international cooperation for climate action.</u>









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Three Components of the GST

- 1. The CMA decided (decision 19/CMA.1, paragraph 3) that the GST will consist of three components:
 - **a. The information collection and preparation component**, focusing on gathering, compiling and synthesizing information and preparing for conducting the technical assessment;
 - **b.** The technical assessment component, "focusing on taking stock of the implementation of the Paris Agreement to <u>assess</u> the collective progress towards achieving the purpose and long-term goals of the Paris Agreement, as well as <u>opportunities for enhanced action and support</u> to achieve its purpose and goals";
 - **c.** The consideration of outputs component, "focusing on discussing the implications of the findings of the technical assessment with a view to achieving the outcome of the global stocktake of <u>informing Parties</u> in <u>updating and enhancing</u>, in a nationally determined manner, <u>their actions and support</u>, in accordance with relevant provisions of the Paris Agreement, as well as in <u>enhancing international cooperation for climate action</u>".






The technical assessment component will end at the 58th session of the SBs, at which the third technical dialogue will take place.

This component includes **technical dialogues and Joint Contact Groups**, held during the three SB sessions preceding the consideration of outputs. The dialogues will be facilitated by two co-facilitators, each from a developing and developed country, and will be guided by questions developed by the SBSTA and SBI Chairs on each thematic area and crosscutting issues.

Thematic Areas of the Dialogue



Organize its work in line with taking stock of the ^{ecbi} implementation of the Paris Agreement to assess the collective progress towards achieving its purpose and long-term goals, including under Article 2, paragraph 1(a–c), in the thematic areas of mitigation, adaptation and means of implementation and support, noting, in this context, that the global stocktake may take into account, as appropriate, efforts related to its work that:

(i) <u>Address the social and economic consequences and impacts</u> <u>of response measures</u>;

(ii) Avert, minimize and address loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change;



The two co-facilitators that will facilitate the technical dialogue will be responsible for conducting the dialogue "and for preparing **a factual synthesis report and other outputs of the technical assessment**, with the assistance of the secretariat".

The co-facilitators of the technical dialogue will summarize **its outputs** in **summary reports**, taking into account equity and the best available science, for each thematic area referred to in paragraph 6(b) and **an overarching factual synthesis of these reports** in a cross-cutting manner".

<u>Outputs of the technical component to be considered in</u> <u>the consideration of outputs component</u>



- a. Outputs of the technical dialogue: factual synthesis report and other outcomes prepared by the cofacilitators.
- b. The thematic summary reports prepared by the cofacilitators;
- c. The overarching, factual and cross-cutting synthesis of the thematic summary reports, all of them prepared by the co-facilitators.

Objective of the Consideration of the outputs of the technical component:



Paragraph 34 (a) and (b) of decision 19/CMA.1 provides some guidance on the content of these outputs

"(a) Identify **opportunities** for and **challenges** in **enhancing action and support for collective progress** in relation to the thematic areas of the global stocktake referred to in paragraph 6(b) above, as well as **possible measures and good practices** and **international cooperation and related good practices**"; (b) Summarize **key political messages**, including **recommendations** arising from the" high-level events "for strengthening action and enhancing support". <u>Consideration of the outputs of the technical</u> <u>component:</u>



Paragraph 33:

Decides that the consideration of outputs will consist of high-level events where the findings of the technical assessment will be presented and their implications discussed and considered by Parties, and that the events will be chaired by a high-level committee consisting of the Presidencies of the Conference of the <u>Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris</u> Agreement and the Chairs of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and the Subsidiary **Body for Implementation;**


